


The Nerima City Guide for Everyday Living (Foreign Language Handbook)

Status of Residence

To acquire or change your status of residence, or to extend your period of stay, please complete the designated procedures at the Tokyo Regional Immigration Services Bureau.

* The procedures for acquiring a status of residence if your child is born in Japan

First, please file a notification of your child's birth (\Rightarrow page 19). Even after birth notification procedures are completed at the City Office for a child of foreign nationality, the child has not yet acquired a status of residence. Please apply for a status of residence within thirty days after the child's date of birth at the Regional Immigration Services Bureau (or within sixty days at the City Office if the child is a special permanent resident). Please be careful, because if you do not apply within sixty days after the child's date of birth, he/she will not be able to remain in Japan legally, and his/her residence record will be deleted.

[What to bring] Birth notification receipt certificate; residence records for the entire household, including the child; and the residence card of the person filing the application (such as the father or mother)

If You Are Leaving Japan

Turn in your residence card to an immigration officer at the airport or port of departure. However, you do not need to return your card at the airport or port if you have a re-entry permit (this includes special reentry permits).

Re-entry Permits

If you receive a re-entry permit, you can leave temporarily and return to Japan while maintaining your status of residence and visa status. Apply at Tokyo Regional Immigration Services Bureau (note: there is a fee).

Special Re-entry Permits

If you will be returning to Japan within one year of leaving (or within two years in the case of special permanent residents), you can take advantage of the special re-entry permit system (free of charge), which does not require you to obtain a re-entry permit. Show the immigration officer at the airport or port of departure your residence card (or special permanent resident certificate) and valid passport, and check the applicable space (\square) on the re-entry ED card.

Turning in Your Residence Card or Special Permanent Resident Certificate

Various Subsidy Programs If you have a residence card or special permanent resident certificate, you must turn it in to the Immigration Services Agency Commissioner within fourteen days after its expiration. You can either bring your card or certificate to the Tokyo Regional Immigration Services Bureau (5-5-30 Konan, Minatoku) in person or mail it to the address below. If you return your card or certificate in person, a hole will be punched in it and it will be returned to you.
